HIST 337. War and European Society in the Twentieth Century. (3-0). Credit 3. War and social change in Europe during the twentieth century; relationships between front lines and home fronts; government and civil society; gender and war; ethnic and national identities in Eastern, Central, and Western Europe. Prerequisite: Junior or senior classification.

HIST 465. Extremism and Terrorism in the Contemporary World. (3-0). Credit 3. History of extremism and terrorism since 1945; underlying social, economic, and political causes; manifestations in Asia, Europe, Latin America, the Middle East, and the United States. Prerequisite: Junior or senior classification.

HORT 440. International Horticulture. (3-0). Credit 3. Examines the source of horticultural commodities; shows how geography, culture, politics, and history influence our markets, gardens and refrigerators; educates students on interpreting different garden styles. Prerequisite: Junior or senior classification.
